May Mary, who was able to offer all her sufferingat the foot of the cross, strengthen our hearts when we are besieged by suffering.

May Mary, who is the universal mother, open our hearts to all humankind.

With her, the first lay person in the Church, and through her spirituality, also we, lay people, can be capable undertaking the task to which the Church calls us today: working for our sanctification, which is the vocation of all Christians; contributing to the renewal of the Church and spreading its message; transforming in a Christian way the world in which are immersed.
